- Need help telling their story

















THE INTERVIEW






DO:

- ✓ Relate your experience or connection
- ✓ Put them at ease
- ✓ Check your implicit biases at the door
- ✓ Ask about post-military education
- ✓ Use behavioral interview questions






DON'T:

- √ Feel intimidated
- ✓ Assume they want management
- ✓ Presume disabilities
- ✓ Forget what you can and can't ask

Why did you join the military?


During your time in the military, did you ever kill anyone?




