Other Notes

- Discussion was had on thermometers.
 - Some chapters are keeping a log as apprentices come in the door. They check temperature twice – as soon as they come in and 20 minutes later. Have apprentices sign a waiver that the building is under pandemic guidelines, voluntarily participating and will not sue.
 - How to regulate this as people's body temperatures vary: some run high and others low?
 - 104 degrees is max. Anything over must be sent home.
 - Natasha from FLWCC is speaking to a rep that is selling a thermometer that measures skin temperature. She will follow-up with more information and cost.
 - Asked National to consider getting a better discount with a company as they would have a greater buying power with all the IEC chapters
- Preparing for Fall Classes
 - Chapter will be practicing social distancing and online. Many chapters are considering a hybrid of in class and online classes and are also considering a 12-month schedule.
 - Some are focusing classroom space for Labs for 3rd and 4th year apprentices.
 - One chapter will allow the first 100 students that enroll to do in-person class while the others will have to do online.
 - Looking at current classroom space to see how many apprentices can fit accommodating social distancing
 - There was a discussion on labs and how chapters use them.
 - Can the New Worker Program be taken online?
- ATP
 - Are they prepared for the fall?
 - More chapters may opt for drop ship as opposed to receiving the curriculum at their office and having a gathering where they would distribute it to the students. What would be the lead time ATP needs? How much is S&H?
 - Can a few lessons be uploaded for the start of the schoolyear? This would help in case there are any CMS logistics with logging-in.
